HSE West Pilot Programme

- HSE West Ambulance Service and Cardiac Unit in UCHG are piloting an 'optimal reperfusion strategy'
- To manage within present Ambulance and Cardiac resource - **only those patients that would go to University College Hospital Galway are presently included in pilot programme.**
- Lesions learned in the HSE West Programme will feed back into National ACLS .

To save lives and as well as improve resource utilisation in the Galway area by modernising the detection and treatment of ACS.

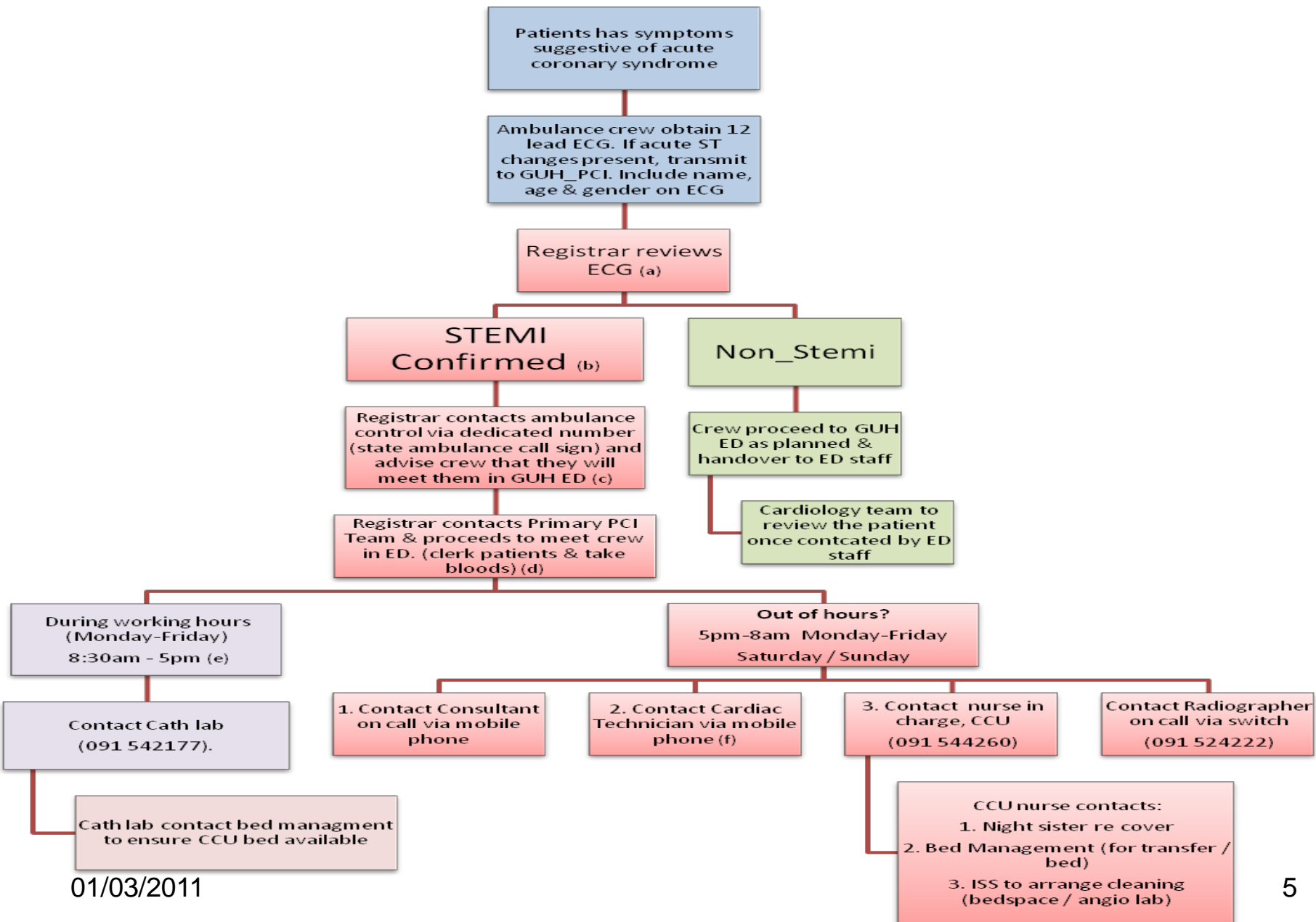
Objectives

Initial focus

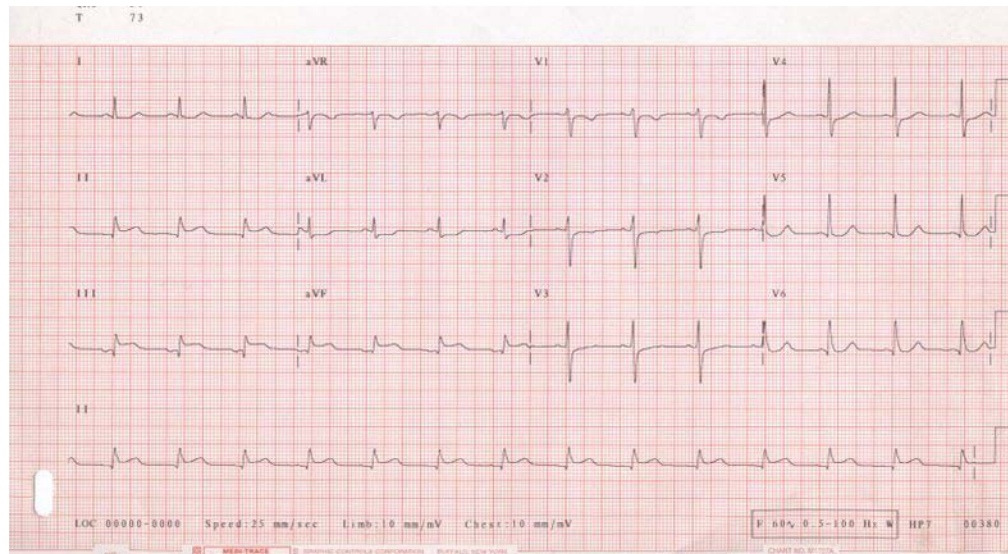
- Only those patients that would go to University College Hospital Galway are presently included in pilot programme.

Galway Optimal Reperfusion Pilot (October 2010)



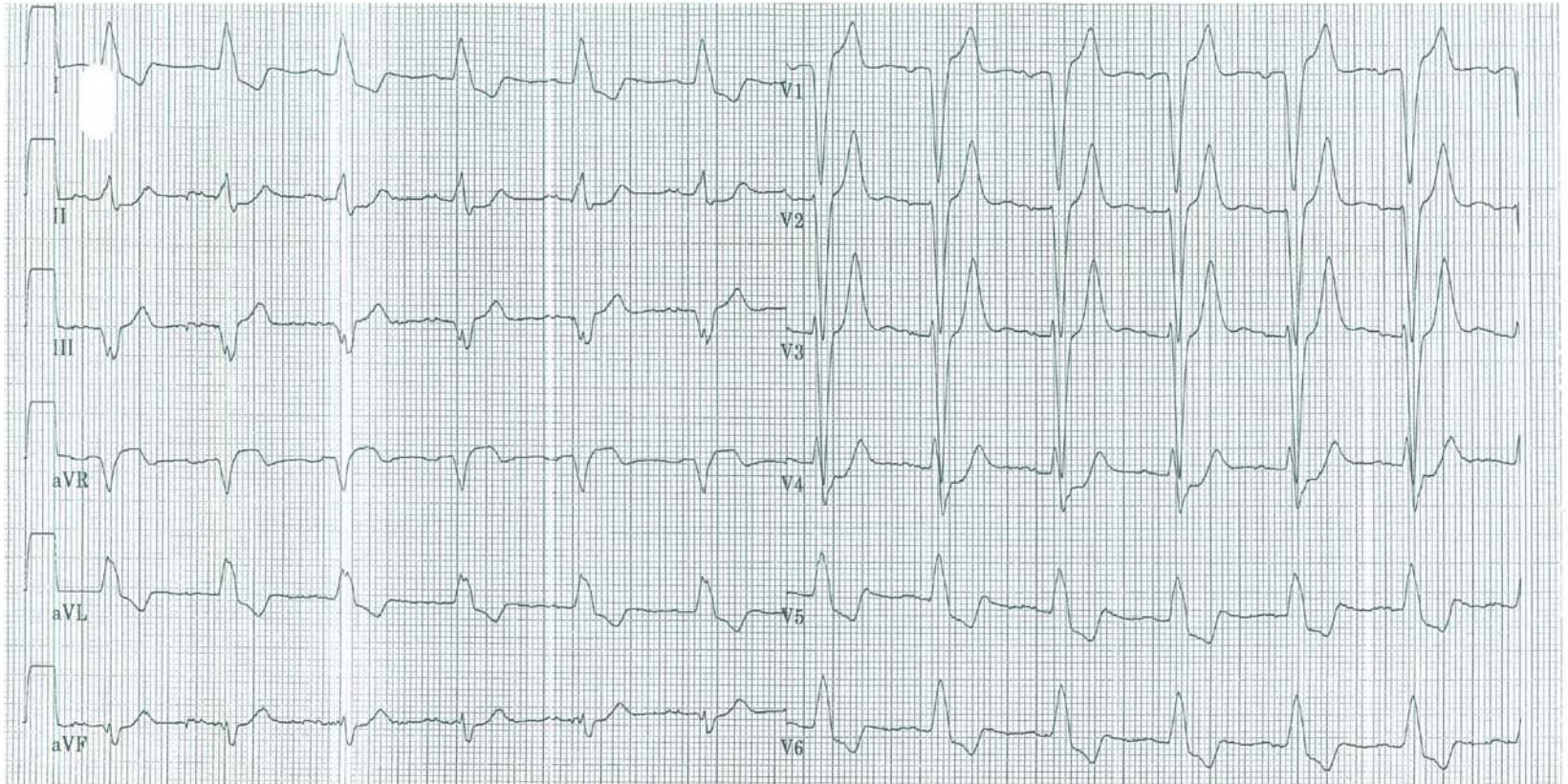

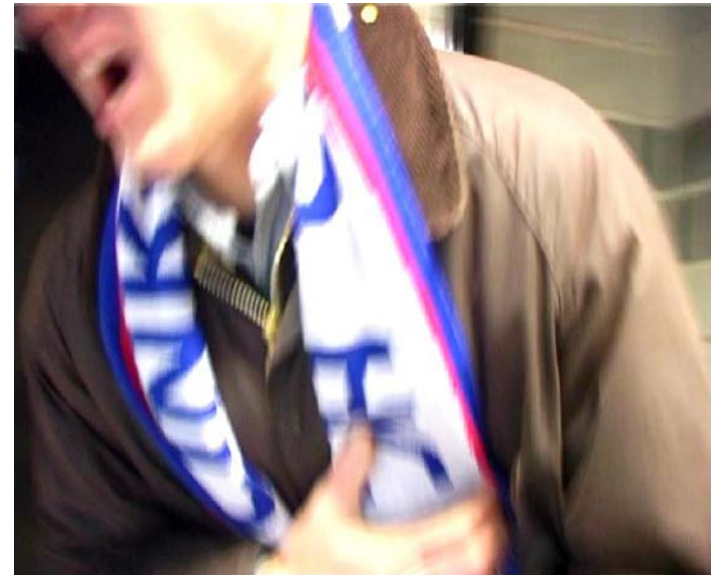

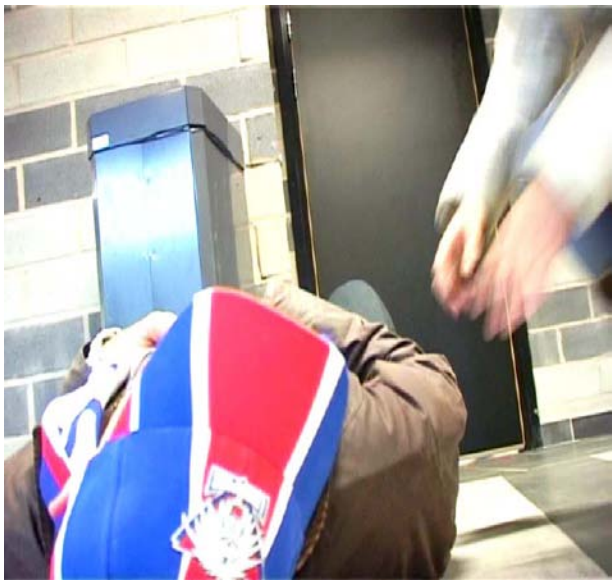
Lateral

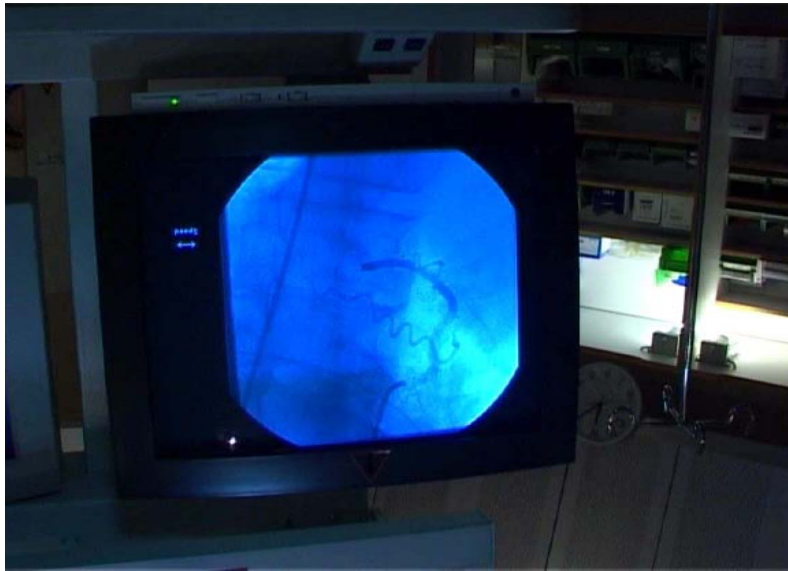
